TIP #1

Choose your search words carefully! Think about what you would need to know for each section, and pick search terms accordingly. Be specific.

TIP #2

Search engines. There's more to Google than Google. You can try "Google Books" or "Google Scholar." Don't limit yourself to just one.

TIP #3

Evaluate websites. How does the URL end (.gov, .edu, .org, etc.)? Who wrote the page you're looking at? What is their experience with disasters? Think!

TIP #4

Don't forget about books! The library is full of books like "Witness to Disaster," and many of them have useful survival info. Check 'em out!
